Sustainable Cotton in Retailing:

A WWF & BCI

Seminar for European Retailers & Brands with EC Switch Asia SPRING Project

Cotton is a natural and breathable fibre which the customers around the world love to see in their clothes; it is also renewable, recyclable and biodegradable. But there are challenges to consider when sourcing this fiber - a fiber which impacts the livelihoods of millions of farmers and factory workers worldwide. Today more & more consumers, brands & retailers are becoming conscious about chemical and water use, bonded or child labour, gender inequality, low pay and other reputational risks linked to the origin of the cotton. Besides exploring choices for sourcing the cotton & cotton products sustainably, responsible businesses are looking forward to improve cotton sourcing procedures through more traceability, control & visibility in their cotton supply chain.

WWF Pakistan and partners are implementing a project on sustainable cotton production in Pakistan's cotton ginning SMEs. One component of this project is to engage retailers and brands in Europe in support of sustainable cotton production. This project is funded by the European Union. WWF and BCI hosted a seminar for companies involved in sourcing cotton products on Friday 26th April in London. Marks & Spencer very kindly hosted the event at their Merchant Square offices in London. The seminar provided an opportunity to the participants to discuss the risks and opportunities involved in cotton production, and how retailers are using Better Cotton to manage their sustainability agenda. More than 40 leading brands & retailers & businesses including IKEA, M&S, Levi's, ASDA, TESCO, Adidas, WALMART, NEXT, PRIMARK attended the seminar.

It is hoped that this seminar will help WWF & BCI efforts for promoting sustainable cotton sourcing among world leading brands, retailers & businesses leading to mainstreaming Better Cotton globally.

The opening session was meant to take the participants through the story of cotton from field to retail, in the format of a panel discussion, documentary film and Q & A. The panel consisted of Asad Imran; WWF-Pakistan, Becci May; WWF-UK, Sophia Jumain; BCI, Carl Peltzer; Cargill, Arvind; Cotton Connect & Mark Sumr; M&S. The session was moderated by Lilly Milligan; BCI

The panel discussion included many key topics such as: Why we need to improve the sustainability of cotton production. The business case for retailers and brands to source cotton sustainably. How Better Cotton is developing into a mainstream commodity solution, and practical how to be on sourcing Better Cotton through supply chain & building cotton sustainability into Corporate Social Responsibility targets.

The afternoon was broken into three detailed how-to sessions on

- 1) Better Cotton claims and communication,
- 2) Supply Chain and Better Cotton Traceability and
- 3) Investment in Supply.

Sustainable Consumption & Production; Choices for a Living Planet









WWF-P SPRING Team Conducts third Seminar regarding "SUSTAINABLE CONSUMPTION & PRODUCTION"

on World Environment Day, 2013 at Islamia University Bahawalpur.

WWF-P in collaboration with Islamia University Bahawalpur and Environment Protection Department-Punjab organized a seminar "Sustainable Consumption & Production" on World Environment Day i:e 5th June, 2013 at Ghotvi Hall, Islamia University Bahawalpur.



This year's theme of World environment day was Think.Eat.Save. Think.Eat.Save was an anti-food waste and food loss campaign to reduce our food prints. According to the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), every year 1.3 billion tons of food is wasted which is equivalent to the same amount produced in the whole of sub-Saharan Africa. At the same time, 1 in every 7 people in the world go to bed hungry and more than 20,000 children under the age of 5 die daily due to hunger. Mr. Mukhtar Ahmad, Vice Chancellor Islamia University Bahawalpur, said that it is our joint responsibility to provide better and pollution free environment to the young generation which is highly important for living. He further told that we can easily asses the quality of food and fruits develop under natural environment as compared to the genetically processed food and fruits. He said that we have to adopt strict measures to control pollution to keep environment healthy. Imran Sikander Baloch (The DCO Bahawalpur), Asad Imran (Senior Programme Manager WWF-P), Muhammad Rafique (District Officer Environment), Syed Israr Hussain Shah (President Civil Society Network, Bahawalpur), SWITCH Asia SPRING Team, faculty members and 400 students attended the seminar. The DCO Bahawalpur, Imran Sikander in his address said that the wastage of water, energy and natural resources are the major causes of destruction and natural calamity so we have to find effective ways to meet the environmental challenges for the protection of human beings, livestock and wildlife. We also have to save trees which are a good source of controlling floods and we have to form a policy in this regard to save environment from pollution. The Senior Programme Manager WWF, Asad Imran in his address urged to change general attitude and said that we should start saving natural resources as it has been noticed that we are wasting a lot of water in personal and domestic practices so we need to review our approach in this regard. The District Officer, Environment, Bahawalpur, Muhammad Rafique informed that Solid Waste and Water Treatment plants are being set-up alongside the industries to control pollution. He also told that recently 1 million plants have been planted in the area to overcome the environmental pollution as there is a need to promote forests.

This activity got a huge publicity in print and electronic media and most importantly the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) has displayed the pictures and proceedings of this event on their website.







Ginners Orientation Session, June 11, 2013

WWF-P and BCI organized all Better Cotton ginners orientation session in Rahim Yar Khan on June 11, 2013. Seth Arshad a renowned ginner welcomed all the ginners and other guests present in meeting. He was among the pioneer ginners. Dr. Shafiq Ahmad, Chairman regard individual BCI presented the clear picture of BCI and principles & criteria of future plans e.g. capacity, project and process. Mr. Shuaib, Pakistan Supply Chain Coordinator shared "Better Cotton" Supply Chain, Progress/development, Challenges to BCI and Aims of BCI with the audience.

Arif Hamid Makhdum, Director Sustainable Agriculture Program briefed the ginners about their role in sustainability. Through different power point presentations he tried to motivate the ginners about their role in project funding. He also explained in detail different financial models and proposals that can serve as steps towards sustainability and highlighted the importance of starting this journey towards sustainability as soon as possible. Better Sugar Cane Initiative organizes Bonsucro Producer Level 2 Training at Bangkok, Thailand.

Bonsucro Producer Level 2 Training was held at Bangkok, Thailand by Better Sugar Cane Initiative (Bonsucro) from 21-22 May, 2013. Mr Farhan Ahmad from WWF-P attended this training. Bonsucro is a private, non-governmental, not-for-profit initiative dedicated to ensure that sugar cane and its derived production, processing and milling are sustainable, reducing undesirable environmental and social impacts. Bonsucro has developed a standard for certification that is still being tested on the field. Participants came from Pakistan, Thailand, France, Turkey, China and United Kingdom (London). The purpose of training was to develop better understanding of Bonsucro Certification Protocol, Production Standard, Bonsucro Calculator,



Mass Balance Chain of Custody Standard and Credit Trading System. The training was facilitated by Mr. Nicolas Viart, Head of Sustainability, Better Sugarcane Initiative (Bonsucro), London, United Kingdom (UK). Mr. Farhan the representative of WWF-P was also encouraged by Nicolas to share his experiences in dealing with farming community in Pakistan and significant output of SuPSI project. Which he did through a power point presentation and received a lot of appreciation from training participants.

The basic objective of this meeting was to provide a platform to both stakeholders (Ginners & Spinners) where they can highlight their issues/problems and can also share their suggestions to develop strategies for strengthening the Better Cotton supply chain and preservation of cotton quality. SWITCH Asia- SPRING team had also made proper arrangements for the visit of ginners and spinners from all three regions to Ahmad Fine Textile Mills & Ahmad Oriental Spinning Unit where they not only observed but were also briefed by the General Managers of Ahmad Fine Textile Mill & Ahmad Oriental Spinning Unit about the issues/problems that are being created due to impurities and foreign matters in lint.

It is important to develop direct links between cotton ginners and spinners not only to strengthen the cotton supply chain and to improve the quality of cotton but also to boost Better Cotton trade volume. It is worth mentioning here that it was for the first time that such concept to create direct link between both stakeholders was initiated under SWITCH Asia Project. Both partners took keen interest and also made some commitments. Participants were of the opinion that not only biannually meeting is necessary but also the presence of textile owners is mendatory for some important decisions like reward against quality base payment.
