




- DRAFT HERITAGE SETTLEMENT RECOVERY PLAN OF BUNGAMATI has been submitted to the community and BARDeC

- NRs. 700,000.00 has been spend by the project for the revitalization of the pond.




Public Rest House:

Design Completed:


- Enhancement of Bungamati Museum (Estimated Cost for Implementation – NRs. 800,00)

- Jawalakhel Bus Park Design




CAPACITY BUILDING OF COMMUNITIES

- Assisting BARDeC in rebuilding the objective














EXPOSURE VISITS
