

Established criteria for 40 products







68 procuring entities(16.7%) consistently adopted green specifications in their procurement of non-CSE items and equipment



228 procuring entities (56%) inconsistently adopted green specifications in their procurement of non-CSE items and equipment 38

38 procuring entities (9.3%) that did not consistently adopt green specifications in their procurement of non-CSE items and equipment







Results (as of December 2021)



Trainings related to GPP continued despite the pandemic, delivered through webinars.

A total of **140 GPPB Recognized Trainers** underwent trainings. Meanwhile, **40 Procuring Entities** were given trainings as of December 2021.
