THIMPHU

Nestled in the heart of the Himalayas, Thimphu, the capital of Bhutan, captivates tourists with its unique blend of tradition and modernity. 1. NORTHERN CITY CENTRE

FOLK HERITAGE MUSEUM

Set in a traditional farmhouse, it displays artifacts, tools, and exhibits depicting Bhutanese daily life, offering visitors an immersive journey into the kingdom's rich cultural heritage.

TASHICHHODZONG

Tashichhodzong, Thimphu's fortress-monastery, exemplifies Bhutanese architecture. A sacred site, it houses government offices, monks, and the king's throne.

ROYAL TEXTILE MUSEUM

The Royal Textile Museum in Thimphu, Bhutan, showcases the kingdom's rich textile heritage. The museum exhibits an extensive collection of textiles, garments, and artifacts, providing visitors insight into the intricate artistry and cultural significance of Bhutanese weaving.

ZORIG CHUSUM

The Traditional School of 13 Arts and Crafts in Thimphu, Bhutan, preserves and imparts traditional Bhutanese arts. Students learn a range of skills, from painting and sculpture to woodworking and weaving.





2. KUENSELPHODRANG - THE BUDDHA DORDENMA STATUE

The Buddha Dordenma statue in Thimphu, Bhutan, stands at 169 feet, symbolizing peace and happiness. Adorned in gold and overlooking the valley, it is a majestic embodiment of Bhutan's devotion to Buddhism and spiritual prosperity.

3. DRUK PATH/PHOJODING MONASTERY

The Druk Path Trail explores ancient paths above Paro and Thimphu Valleys. Crossing alpine lakes and sacred mountain temples, the trail arrives at Phojojing Monastery right above the capital city.

4. THIMPHU TSHECHU

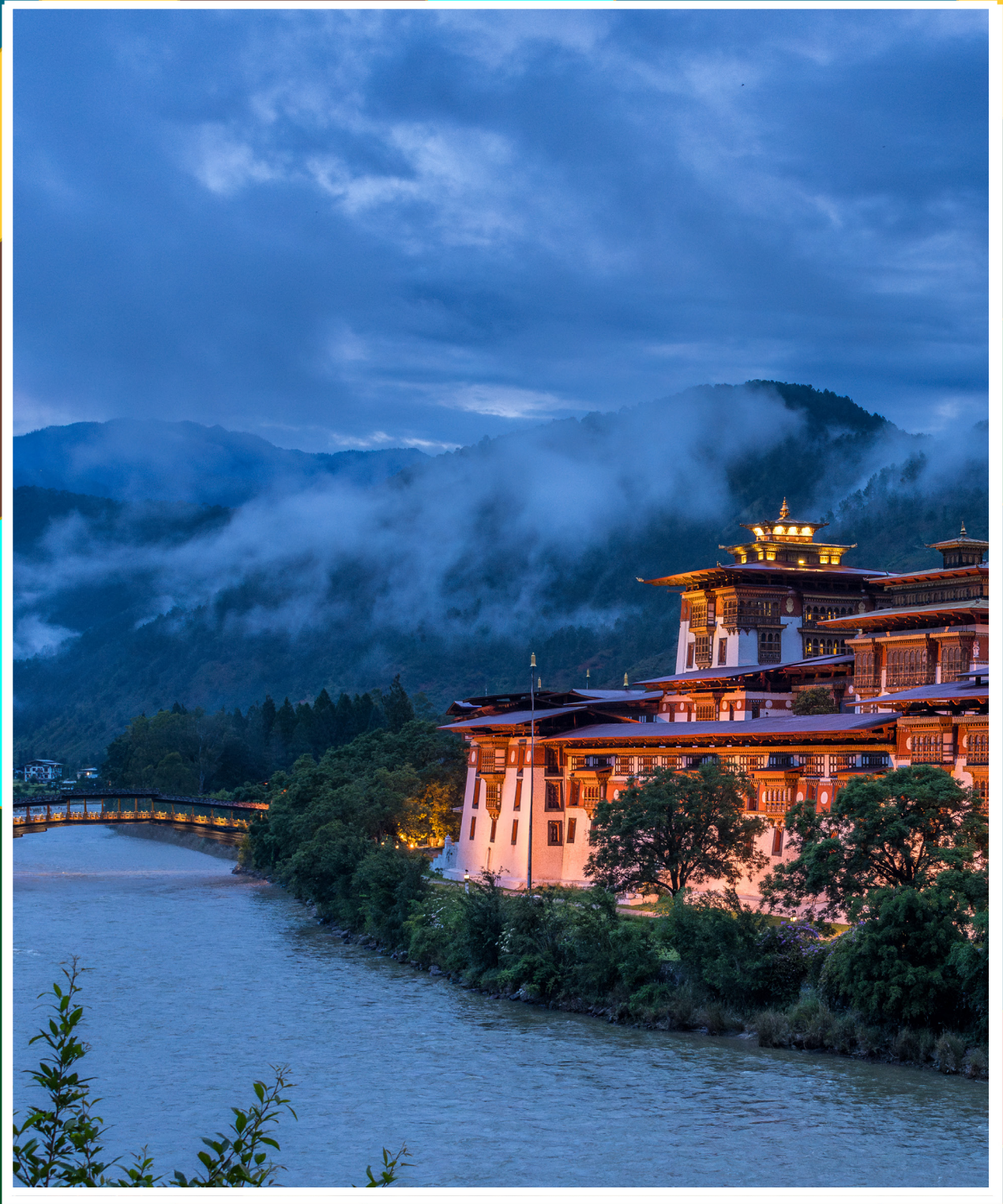
Thimphu Tshechu festival features lively masked dances, religious rituals, and the unfurling of sacred Thongdrels, fostering spiritual devotion and community unity

5. TANGO & CHARI MONASTERIES

These two monasteries perched on the mountains of northern Thimphu takes guest on beautiful pine and fir forest hikes.









PUNAKHA

6. DOCHULA PASS

Dochula Pass, situated at 3,100 meters in Bhutan, offers breathtaking panoramic views of the Himalayas. Adorned with 108 chortens, it is a serene mountain pass and a popular stopover.



7. PUNAKHA DZONG

Punakha Dzong, a majestic fortress in Bhutan, stands at the confluence of the Pho Chhu and Mo Chhu rivers. Adorned with intricate Bhutanese architecture, vibrant frescoes, and housing sacred relics, it is a spiritual and cultural centerpiece, echoing the nation's rich heritage.

8. CHHIMI LHAKHANG

Chimi Lhakhang, known as the "Fertility Temple," is a quaint Bhutanese shrine dedicated to Drukpa Kunley.

9. PUNAKHA DOMCHHEN

This festival also showcases a unique warrior festival during its first day. Local Bhutanese take part dressed as ancient Pazaps.

10. PARO TOUR (DZONG, MUSUEM, TOWN)

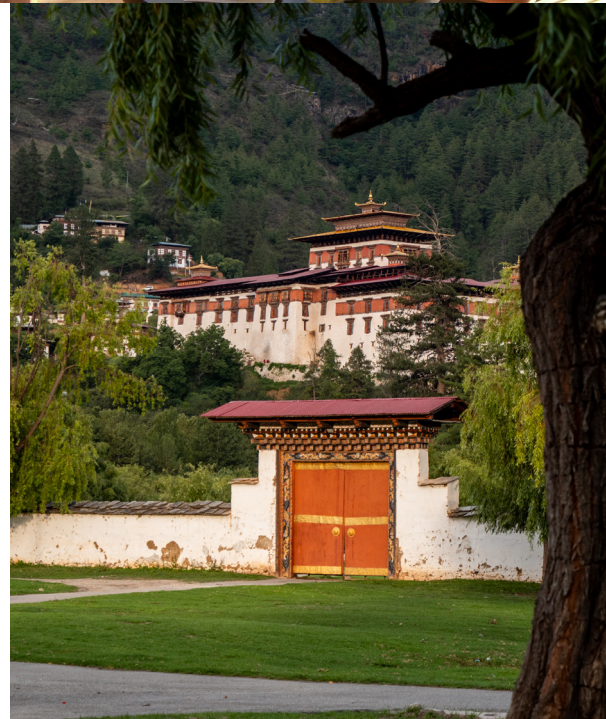

12. CHELELA & KILA GOENPA

Enjoy breathtaking mountain views from Chelela Pass & visit the ancient nunnery on the cliff.







13. PARO TAKTSHANG

Paro Taktshang, or Tiger’s Nest Monastery, clings daringly to a cliff in Bhutan. A sacred pilgrimage site, the monastery offers breathtaking views of Paro Valley. Legend tells of Guru Rinpoche’s flight on a tiger to meditate here, infusing the site with spiritual significance.

14. PARO AIRPORT

Paro International Airport, Bhutan’s sole international airport, is nestled between mountains. Renowned for its challenging approach, it offers a unique landing experience, surrounded by stunning Himalayan landscapes

15. HAA HOMESTAYS
